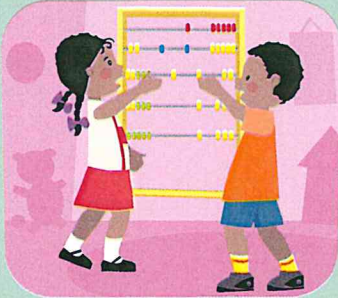


DOES YOUR KINDERGARTENER NEED THAT EXTRA HELP WITH SCHOOL?

Pick up and turn in your registration form no later than Sunday June 12, at 41 West Thurman Avenue. For additional information please call Annamarie Olson at 782-7487.

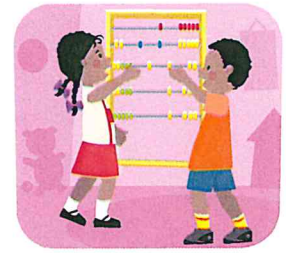

The Skill Building Program is for those students that need extended help in the subject areas of Math, Reading, Writing, and the overall English language.

This program is strictly for those who are currently in Kindergarten and going into the First grade in August 2016. The skill building series schedule will include sessions in Math, Reading, and Writing for 6 weeks. The program session will be 4 hours per day, Monday – Friday, 9 am - 1 pm, and will take place at the **Margaret J. Slattery Children's Library at 256 East Orange Avenue** inside the Heritage Center.

The Porterville City Library will provide the educational materials, a daily snack, and instructors. The Library staff are not trained educators but we have ran a sustainable program with the Santa Fe Elementary School for several school years that provides the same skill building service to at-risk students. Parents are welcome to volunteer and participate in all skill building activities.

****This is a FREE service to the Porterville community and it is entirely geared for those students who really need that extra help with early learning skills.**
